Nature of terrain, slips, trips, and falls – personal injuries, sprains, and strains.	Young People, Leaders.	Check for natural hazards in the build area. Make sure everyone wearing suitable footwear. Assess the weather risk before and during the session. Consider moving this activity to another area if needed. All leaders to carry first aid kits. Administer first aid as required.	
Lost Children – children becoming separated from the main group, children going to other areas than those designated for the activity.	Young People,	Remind Cubs of the designated area for the game before beginning. Leaders to monitor Cubs with regular head counts throughout the game. Cubs to have a designated place to go to if they are lost and unsure where to go. Cubs to be put into mixed age groups to help the younger beavers know where to go throughout the game. Have a lost child policy in place with the Leaders should a Cub stray from the main group.	
Weather – adverse weather conditions due to rain, hot weather/dehydration	Young People, Leaders	Cubs have been sent a letter home reminding them to bring appropriate footwear, raincoat and suncream as needed. Consider moving activity to another location should this weather deteriorate or become too hot.	
Injury from equipment	Young people, Leaders	All leaders to carry first aid kits and administer first aid as required. All Cubs to be made aware of how injury could occur and how to stay safe during the activity.
