Nature of terrain, slips, trips, and falls to gain access to the hut – personal injuries, sprains, and strains.	All	Check for natural hazards in the build area. Make sure everyone wearing suitable footwear. All leaders to carry first aid kits. Administer first aid as required.	
Lost Children – children becoming separated from the main group, children going to other areas than those designated for the activity.	Cubs	Remind Cubs of the designated area for the sleepover at the start of the camp. Leaders to monitor Cubs with regular head counts throughout the night away. Cubs to have a designated place to go to if they are lost and unsure where to go. Have a lost child policy in place with the Leaders should a Cub stray from the main group. Have a tour of Spitewinter on arrival and familiarise the Cubs with the area.	
Trip/falls around tents	All,	All Cubs to be allocated a sleeping space. Cubs to only access their sleeping space at bedtime. Areas around the sleeping space are to be kept clear and tidy. Cubs to keep their belongings within their tent. Guide ropes – trips and falls over – make Cubs aware of potential hazards.	
Toileting in the night	Cubs.	Discuss with Cubs if they need the toilet in the night and need help then to request an adult. Male with boys to toilets and female leaders with the girls. Spare sleeping bags/roll mats for children.
